

BYLAW NO. 143 - 2009

A BYLAW TO RECOVER PROTECTIVE SERVICES COSTS

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Indian Head No. 156 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw:
 - a) "Administrator" shall mean the administrator of the municipality;
 - b) "Council" shall mean the council of the municipality; and
 - c) "Municipality" shall mean the Rural Municipality of Indian Head No. 156
2. The cost of fire protection, suppression and emergency response services shall be charged directly on the persons who receive the service in accordance with Schedule "A" which is attached to and forming a part of this bylaw.
3. The Council authorizes the Administrator to add to the taxes of any property owned by the person referenced in Section 2 of this bylaw any amount which remains unpaid at the end of the calendar year.

Schedule "A" to Bylaw No. 143 - 2009

Charges for Fire Fighting and Emergency Response Services as referenced in Bylaw No. 143/2009 shall be as follows:

- (a) Five Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per hour, to be computed from the time the fire-fighting equipment or rescue equipment leave the Emergency Response Centre to the time they return, shall be charged for each fire or emergency response call where the equipment or manpower are called to assist at a fire or emergency situation; and,
- (b)
 - i) Actual costs of wages for all personnel responding to and associated with the particular call; and
 - ii) Actual costs of wages for all personnel attending the call or fire-fighting or emergency services; and
 - (iii) Actual consumable material used during the response.
- (c) a sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) shall be charged for a false alarm. A false alarm is considered to be a fire or emergency response call for which fire-fighting or emergency equipment has been called, but for which no fire or emergency situation exists.
