


TARPING BYLAW

BYLAW NO. 210/98

A BYLAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF INDIAN HEAD NO. 156, IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN, TO ENFORCE THE USE OF COVERS ON TRUCKS AND OTHER VEHICLES UNDER THE NOXIOUS WEED ACT.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Indian Head No. 156, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:


1. Before any grain, field crop seeds, crushed grain, cleanings of any kind, or forage/fodder, excepting silage and products that are wrapped, bagged or baled, while being moved within the municipality, shall be covered in a manner that will prevent the spread of noxious weeds during such movement.
2. Boxes on any vehicles used to transport any of the materials mentioned in Paragraph 1 of this bylaw shall be covered with a securely fastened tarpaulin or similar cover, when moving on public roads anywhere within the municipality.
3. A legible card, containing the provisions of this bylaw shall be conspicuously posted in all elevators, seed cleaning plants and seed warehouses within the municipality.
4. Any person who violates any provisions of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of not more than \$500.00 as provided under the Noxious Weeds Act, 1984 and amendments thereto.
5. Bylaw No. 209/98 is hereby repealed.


