

**BYLAW NO. 225/2004**

**A BYLAW COMPELLING THE REMOVAL OF EARTH, STONES, RUBBISH AND OTHER ENCUMBRANCES, INCLUDING FENCES, OFF OF MUNICIPAL ROADS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO SECTION 206 (2) (h)**

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Indian Head No. 156, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. Anyone who places earth, stones, rubbish and other encumbrances, including fences on municipal roads within the municipality will be compelled to remove it at the direction of Council.
2. If the Council directs the removal of anything from the municipal road and it is not done within the period set out in the letter directing the removal, the municipality will, after the expiration of the time set out in the letter, remove the object from the road.
3. Costs associated with the removal of earth, stones, rubbish and other encumbrancers may be recovered in the same manner as municipal taxes.
4. This bylaw comes into force upon passage of third reading.
